### Healthy snacks

As you know we received healthy school status in July 2007. We agreed back then that all snacks for playtime should be either fresh fruit or vegetables. This is following on from the fresh fruit scheme offered to all Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 children. Children should be sent to school with a mid morning snack of either fresh fruit or vegetables. It is a long morning between having breakfast and lunchtime so it is really important the children have sufficient "fuel" to enable them to do their best learning. Having a bottle of water they can access through lesson time is also really important to good learning.

Lunch boxes should contain a good balance and should not include chocolate bars. The eating habits that children learn now will affect their later lifestyles.

Please help us to help your children.

### First Aid procedures

We are constantly reviewing and revising our policies and procedures at Staplegrove to ensure the best provision for your children. And in response to your comments and new statutory guidance, we have made some changes. I have put the key changes down in this newsletter but the full guidance is available on the school website.

One of the main changes is to how we administer medicine in school. Prescribed medicine should only be brought into school when essential. Parents should where possible ask the doctor to prescribe in dose frequencies that fit outside the school day. If it does need to be taken during the school day and administered by a

member of staff, the medicine needs to come into the school office in the original container. This should have the name of the child and the clear dosage displayed on the pharmacy label. You will be required to complete a form giving your permission and the school will complete an agreement to do this. Medication will be stored in the staff room, either in the fridge or in a marked cupboard. It is your responsibility to come and collect this from the office at the end of the day.

The school rule still remains that if a child is ill enough to be put on a course of antibiotics they should have time to get well in the home environment where their progress can be monitored carefully. Children prescribed antibiotics MUST stay home for a full 24 hours after the first dose and can return any time after this as long as they are well enough. We do understand how difficult it is for working parents but children who are clearly not well enough to be in school will be sent home. It is not fair on school staff or the other children in the class.

The school will administer non-prescribed medicines (apart from any product containing Ibuprofen such as Calpol) with written permission of the parent. This should have clear instructions about the dose and frequency. These will be stored in a clearly labelled box in the staff room.

### Calculations Evening

So many of you have said to us that “maths is not taught the same as when we were at school!” For this reason we are running a special “calculations evening” which will be accompanied by a help leaflet explaining how addition, subtraction, multiplication and division are taught at the different stages at Staplegrove. Miss Bolton will run this session and it is open to all parents. The date will be Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> December at 6.30pm. Please complete the attached sheet to book your place.

### SCS-school dinners

We have just been informed of the annual price increase for SCS school dinners which will take effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010. This will mean that a two course meal will be :

SCS are also offering from January an option where you can order just the main course :

Key stage 1	£1.85 (just main course)
Key stage 2	£1.95 (just main course)

### FOSS
